Also includes Evidence-based Care Sheets, Quick Lessons on a variety of topics, CEU (Continuing Education Units) records, and Research instrument records. Includes material from **CINAHL Select** and **Pre-CINAHL** (contains references to new journal articles for which complete records have not yet appeared). So searching **CINAHL Plus with Full Text** provides the most comprehensive full-text coverage in Nursing and Health Sciences.
